Medicines

We are very fortunate at Oakdene that we have Staff who are willing to administer medicines to our children in School. Please can I remind all Parents that Medicine needs to be dropped off at the Office by an Adult and a Med 1 form completed.



If you send your child in with a non-prescription medicine we will ask for this to be collected after 5 days (if it has not been collected before) and we will not administer it for any longer than 5 days without a Doctors note. If you do not collect the medicine, we will give it to the Adult who collects your child.

Our Post Box

PLEASE can Parents use the Past Box in the Entrance Foyer for any money coming into the School Office. Our Office Staff do not have the time to take money off each Parent in the morning and this system helps greatly. The Post Box is emptied at least twice each day, often 4 times per day.



Alternatively, please encourage independence for your child and send it in with your child to put in the class envelope. Many children from Reception to Year 6 do this very diligently and it promotes a lot of independence for your child.

Eligibility for Free School Meals

In the past many Parents who have been on certain benefits have been able to claim Free School Meals which in turn provides some income for children in school. Due to the introduction of Universal Credit the system has now changed slightly and, if you apply for Free School Meals now you will never have to re-apply whilst your child is at Oakdene. If you are on one of the following benefits then you will be entitled to Free School Meals:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit) and your annual gross income (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) is not more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit 'run on' paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit and net earnings, from your last assessment period, is not more than £616.67 per month. (If your household's net earnings change each month then they should not exceed £1,233.34 in the last two consecutive months or £1,850 in the past 3 months).

The children at our school never know they are entitled to a free meal and the school receive extra funds to support your child. This is especially useful for Infant children who, although they already receive a Universal Free School Meal, they will be entitled to a Free meal when they go into the Junior until the time they leave.

Christmas Shoebox Appeal

We are, once again, working with the Rotary Club of Rainhill to spread a little happiness to disadvantaged people in Eastern Europe. We always have a fantastic response to our annual Shoebox Appeal as we know the children want to help people who are less fortunate than themselves.

The Children recently heard from a member of Rainhill Rotary Club who have been sending Shoe boxes to Eastern Europe for many years and they were able to see where their shoeboxes will be going to.

We have the shoeboxes in school which the Rotary Club supply (of a standard size) and you can collect one from the Office or complete the form below and we will send a (flat-pack) box home with your child. PLEASE Can you include £2.00 to help with the cost of transporting the boxes.

This year, Rotary are asking people to fill their boxes in a slightly different way and fill them with items of 'Toys', 'Household', 'Teenager' or 'Baby' so that they can distribute the boxes accordingly. You can, of course, still indicate the age of the child for the suitability of the toys.

In 'Toys' suggested items are cars, trucks, balls, new jigsaws, action figures, colouring books, crayons, pens, pencil case, pencil sharpener, lego, yo-yo, bubbles, dominies, pencil case, playdough, fluffy toys, dolls, stickers, paper, skipping rope, scarf, gloves, hat, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc etc.

For Teenagers requested items are: Scarf, gloves, hat, sportswear, football items, writing materials, tennis ball, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodarants, costume jewellery, make up, hair brush, comb etc.

To send Household items please send scarves, gloves, hats, wrapped soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, disposable razors, shampoo, pan scourers, face or body creams, cosmetics, sewing kits, writing items, paper, bandages

For the Baby box please include baby wipes, cotton wool, baby shampoo, baby powder, bootees, mittens, Babygro, blanket, small soft toy or plastic rattle.

If you would not like to fill a complete box, please send in any items so we can fill boxes in School. Please do not puut in food, sweets, chocolate, battery operated toys, matches, conflict related items, inflammable aerosols, seeds or living materials, automatic washing powders, washing up liquid.
