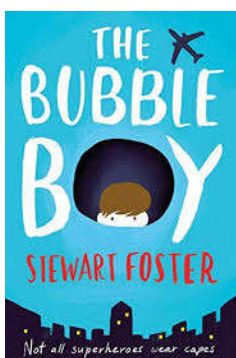

I think that this amazing book should mainly be for 10 or 11-year-olds because of the challenging vocabulary throughout. I highly recommend this book for children of any gender.



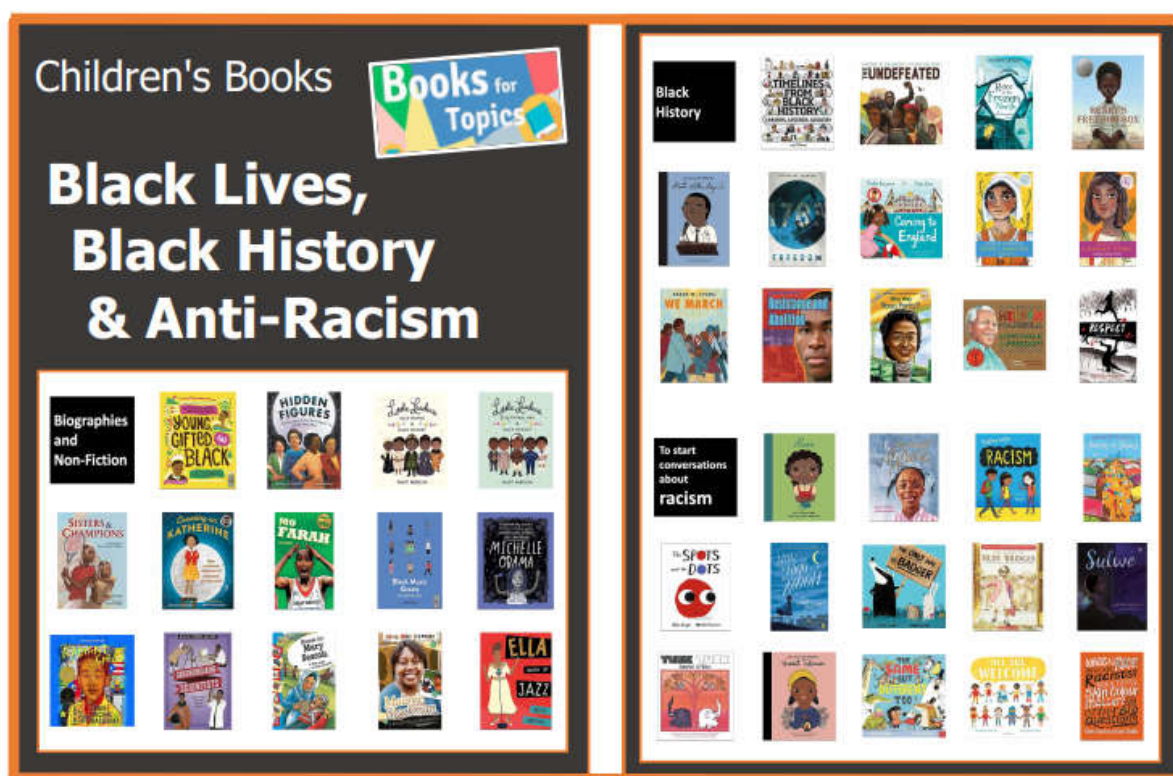
